RE: Town Manager's Report

INTRODUCTION

This monthly report serves as an update to the Town Council on key projects, activities, and community issues.

STREET GRADING OPERATIONS UNDERWAY

The Town began annual street grading operations on Monday, May 8th and the process will continue through May 24th. The street grading consists of using a street grader to restore the driving surface and drainage attributes to the Town's unpaved streets. The process also includes the application of a dust suppressant agent, known as magnesium chloride, to the unpaved streets.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR MASTER PLAN FOR RIDGWAY ATHLETIC PARK

The Town of Ridgway has issued a "Request for Proposal" (RFP) seeking qualified and experienced individuals or firms to submit proposals to provide a plan, process, and approach for the public engagement and master planning for a parks parcel known as the Ridgway Athletic Park. WATER TREATMENT PLANT TOURS

The students weathered the elements and did a great job of listening to our presentation on our watershed, what's in our water, and how our treatment system works.

undertaken. Our Public Works crew (shout out to Jeff Rivera and Bobby Barnes!) worked with representatives of Evergreen Skateparks to update and repair areas of the skatepark to provide for an improved and safer experience for skaters.

FIRST GRADERS BUILD NEST BOXES FOR BLUEBIRDS

Ridgway Elementary School's first grade class built ten bluebird nest boxes and mounted them, with approval, on Town of Ridgway property along the Uncompandere River Trail.

Lumber for the nest boxes was paid for and donated by Black Canyon Audubon Society. BCAS member and former chapter president Jon Horn cut, marked, and assembled the pieces into ten kits specifically crafted for small hands to screw the boxes together.

Students worked in pairs to build the nest boxes with guidance of local naturalist Carrie Krickbaum, PE and outdoor education coordinator Krista Javoronok, and first grade teacher Kelly Croke. As part of the unit, students also learned how to use binoculars and facts about cavity nesting habits of bluebirds and when to expect to see nesting birds.

"Any small bird might live in this house," said thoughtful first-grader Patrick (last name

withheld per school protocol) as he held a box against a tree. "If we put it here, they can see if predators come near them." Students held the boxes against tree trunks or fence posts while an adult used a power screwdriver to attach it.





ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY

In 2021, the Town Council entered into an agreement with CDOT to "adopt" a segment of State Highway 62 from milepost 20 to milepost 22 for a period of two years. As part of that agreement, the Town Council committed to picking up litter a minimum of two times each year. The time has come to pinpoint a date and time to hold another clean up event this summer!



COMMUNITY LAND TRUST CONFERENCE

From Home Trust of Ouray County:

The Home Trust had a strong presence at the Colorado Community Land Trust's Inaugural Conference last week (April 19-20) near Buena Vista.

We want to thank Preston Neill, Ridgway Town Manager, as well as Silas Clarke, City Administrator, and Lily Oswald, Community Development Director, of the City of Ouray for participating in this conference with the Home Trust. Having our local government leadership attending this conference truly exemplified the growing level of support the Home Trust has for addressing affordable housing issues in our region.

Andrea also represented the Home Trust in a panel of speakers discussing the expanding model of Community Land Trusts to include rental and commercial projects, which the Home Trust of Ouray County is on the forefront of doing as well.

REGIONAL GRANTS NAVIGATOR PROGRAM

With support from the State of Colorado, Region 10 has established a Regional Grants Navigator program to support local governments in pursuit of funds from the historic Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. Region 10 has contracted Colleen Hannon to assist with the Regional Grant Navigator Project. Town staff met with Colleen on April 18th to get an update on Region 10's work to date and to give her information on current and future infrastructure projects and our overall needs. Colleen will provide a report in the coming weeks that will detail some available funding opportunities based on the needs that we expressed.

DEVELOPER WORKSHOP

Town staff and consultants will hold a Developer Workshop on Tuesday, May 23rd at 5:30 p.m. The purpose of the Workshop is to give an overview presentation on the new updates to Chapter 7 of the Ridgway Municipal Code and to lead members of the development community through an exercise intended to provide clarity on the new application processes and associated application types. Staff will present development scenarios and explain the application process that an applicant would go through. OURAY COUNTY WORKFORCE TRANSPORTATION PROJECT UPDATE

From Sarah Curtis, Executive Director of All Points Transit:

As of today, May 8th, we have not received a contract for signature from CDOT for our MMOF Ouray Project. I have inquired when we can expect this to be in place, but have not received an answer. We have seen motion on the process from the CDOT side, but I am still concerned that we will not have everything in place by May 26th as we had hoped.

I am attaching a letter from the Colorado Association of Transit Agencies that was sent to CDOT Director Lew; you can see that All Points Transit and this project are not alone in this situation. Our agency is fortunate that the delays are not having the dire impacts on our standard operations as others are experiencing. However, we cannot incur costs for the Ouray project that will be billed to the MMOF grant until that specific contract is in place.

I believe we should plan to delay our launch date until June 15th. I am hopeful that this will give ample time to get the contract in place and allow us to get reimbursements going without risk to our agency or the project.

MARSHAL'S OFFICE UPDATE

From Shane Schmalz, Town Marshal:

Training

On 05-11-2023 Senior Deputy Ryan Hanson and Deputy Jim Duncan attended Human Factors and the Use of Force training.

On 05-06-2023 I took part in Western Slope Law Enforcement Community Discussion. It was held at the 4-H Center and was very well attended by members of communities across the region. It was a very good discussion on law enforcement trends locally and in surrounding areas, and nationally.

Statistics

As of 05-08-2023 we are at 1,643 calls for service and self-initiated field activity as compared to same time in 2022 at 1457 calls for service and self-initiated field activity.

Of those calls for service we have seen an increase in mental health issues occupying a large amount of officers' time. Despite our best efforts, these issues can result in criminal charges, and high risk to the safety of our officers. We are working closely with our Mental Health, Medical, and District Attorney partners to try and address these issues.

Deputy Jeff Pickle Returning Soon

Deputy Jeff Pickle has been out since January 23, 2023, with a non-work-related injury, and we are hoping to have him back the first of June.

FUSE Sponsorship Process Established

In keeping with a goal stated in their strategic plan, FUSE Creative Main Street Program has created and announced a process for providing modest financial sponsorships for community initiatives that promote the creative, historic and/or economic vitality in downtown Ridgway. Examples include events, public art projects, classes etc. We've called the fund "Ignited by FUSE Funds".

Sponsorship proposals will be evaluated by the FUSE committee and awarded on a rolling basis until budgeted funds are expended. \$5,000 has been allocated for sponsorships within the FUSE budget in 2023. Maximum awards will be \$1,000. Limit of one sponsorship per organization per year.

To be considered for sponsorship, organizations or individuals must present a brief proposal about their idea at a FUSE meeting either in person or via Zoom. Proposals should include a description of how the initiative will advance the creative, historic and/or economic vitality of Ridgway, expected timeframe and how the requested funds will be spent.

FUSE committee members or staff will declare any real, potential, or perceived conflicts of interest and abstain from decisions with which they may have a conflict of interest.

Groups who are awarded sponsorships will be required to submit financial documentation as required by the Town such as invoices, receipts and/or tax documentation. Fund recipients will also be asked to include the FUSE logo in branding materials and share photos of the project with FUSE after it is completed.
