INTRODUCTION

This monthly report serves as an update to the Town Council on key projects, activities, and community issues.

RIDGWAY SPACE TO CREATE BLOCK PARTY AND CELEBRATION!

Join Artspace, along with the Town of Ridgway, Ridgway FUSE, and Colorado Creative Industries on Thursday, June 22nd from 4 to 7 p.m. for a fun, festive evening featuring live performances and art exhibitions from the local community. Your friends and family are invited to the official Grand Opening of Ridgway Space to Create and the 10th anniversary of the Ridgway Colorado Creative District!

COMMUNITY GARDEN IMPROVEMENTS

Ridgway Public Works recently completed the various improvements at the Ridgway Community Garden. Gravel was hauled in and spread out in the parking area and weeds were addressed.

UPDATE RE RFP FOR CONSTRUCTION



The COMS team has the draft RFP almost completed to send this out next fiscal year (starting in July). After a few minor tweaks are made, they will send this back to Town staff for one last look. The schedule will be:

- Release in July
- Comments due in 10 days
- Final proposals due approximately three weeks from release date.
- Estimated start date will be late August to early September



COMS anticipates that the proposed budgets within the proposals will be expensive, so COMS may need to get creative on what the program can cover, and what might be asked of the Town. COMS's budget for this project is \$55,000, so we will cross that bridge when we come to it.

NEW POLITICAL BOUNDARY SIGNS INSTALLED

The Town recently purchased three new Type-2 political boundary signs and had them installed at the entrances to Town.

REGIONAL HOUSING CONFERENCE ON JUNE 20TH

Montrose County Housing Authority is hosting a regional housing conference on June 20th that I will attend. Caseworkers, landlords, local government elected officials, planning department team members and housing authority representatives are invited to attend this free event.

This event will focus on Delta, Montrose, Ouray and Gunnison counties, and aims to provide an opportunity for professional development and education among case workers, local government staff and elected officials and landlords.

They have designed three tracks, although attendees may select sessions in alternative tracks if they wish to. The day will begin with keynote speaker Elizabeth Garner, the Colorado State Demographer. HUD Regional Administrator Dominique Jackson will also speak during the networking lunch and the day will close out with a wrap up from Montrose County Commissioner Sue Hansen.

OURAY COUNTY WORKFORCE TRANSPORTATION PROJECT UPDATE

From Sarah Curtis, Executive Director of All Points Transit:

I wanted to let you know that we are still waiting for the CDOT contract to begin the Montrose-Ouray route. At this point, I believe we should plan for launching this route after the 4th of July holiday. I will keep you all posted if anything changes there.

I spoke with Silas yesterday about some hiring challenges, as well, specifically for the evening and weekend shifts for this route. If anyone has ideas for how we might reach employees who live in Montrose and work in Ouray who would also like to get paid to drive our company vehicle, please do not hesitate to send them our way!



In addition - I have a new item for discussion. The "Western Slope Schools Collaborative" has offered to support our vehicle purchase with \$10,000 to help fill the gap on our vehicle funding (yay!). They are requesting that we offer free rides to students for some period of time, to be negotiated. This is an estimated 5-6 student riders per day (possibly less) that are traveling between Ridgway and Montrose and back again. If you have immediate ideas or thoughts, please let us know by email. If you all would like to get together to talk this through, we can set a time for that, as well.

Recently Completed Projects

R5 Yr 5 Bridge Preventative Maintenance- 20706

Budget: \$2 mill Funding Type: Structures Awarded: KSK, LLC This project was located on SH 141 within Montrose County. Preventative maintenance was performed on three select bridges to improve the quality and extend the life of the structures. Construction began in May 2022 and was completed in April 2023.

US 550 Ouray to Colona HMA- 20121

Budget: \$ 17 million for Construction Funding Type: SUR, RPP, FSA, HSIP



Awarded: Kilgore Companies, LLC

This project was combined with the US 550 Billy Creek Surface Treatment work. The project is located on US 550 from Ouray to Colona, approximately MP 94-116. The scope of work includes an HMA leveling course and overlay with a 2-mile section to include shoulder widening between MP 98 and 100. Shouldering work was completed in December, prior to the winter shutdown. Work has resumed and should be complete in May 2023.

Upcoming Projects

US 550 Pacochupuk South Mobility & Billy Crk Safety Improvements- 23601

Budget: \$7 million Funding Type: SUR/SB-267

Ad Date: Summer 2023

This project will take place on US 550 in Ouray County, between approximately MP 106 and 114.5, just north of the Ridgway State Park entrance. The scope of work includes limited shoulder widening, repairing existing deer fencing and connecting new deer fencing to the existing at MP 212.5. A large animal underpass will be constructed at Billy Creek, between MP 114 and 115. HMA patching will take place between Pacochupuk campground and the CR 8 intersection and passing lanes will be added. This project is being designed for Ad in summer 2023.

SH 145 MP 63.4 Wall Replacement- 24148

Budget: \$1.5 mill Funding Type: Walls Ad Date: Fall 2023

This project will take place on SH 145 near Ophir, at approximately MP 63.4. At this location, there are two wooden walls that are in need of replacement. Due to budget limitations, this project has been delayed for advertisement until late 2023 for possible construction in 2024.

US 550 MP 81 & 89 Bluepoint Avalanche Mitigation- 23623

Budget: \$660k Funding Type: GeoHaz

Awarded: Geovert

This project is located on US 550 at approximate MP 81- 89 in Ouray County. This avalanche mitigation project will install a Gasex avalanche system on a known avalanche slide, Bluepoint and an Obelex system on the Mother Cline slide. The installation of these systems will allow maintenance crews to trigger avalanches remotely when needed. This project has been awarded and construction is planned for summer 2023.



R5 FY22 Chain Stations- 24425

Budget: \$5 mill Funding Type: Freight

Ad Date: November 2023

This chain station project will be located on SH 145 in San Miguel County, as well as US 160 Wolf Creek Pass and La Veta Pass, and SH 17 Cumbres Pass. A total of four new chain stations will be constructed or improved. Work will include light installation, widening and paving, conduit installation and guardrails where needed. In addition to chain stations, 4 VMS signs will be replaced in both Region 3 and Region 5. This project went to Ad in February 2023. The bids came in too high and were rejected. The project is being repackaged for re-advertisement in November. The exact chain station locations are below:

- SH 145, MP 71.5 (west of roundabout)
- SH 145, Deep Creek MP 68.9 (paving and no parking signs)
- US 160, La Veta Pass MP 276.7
- SH 17, Cumbres Pass MP 0.1
- US 160, Wolf Creek Upper East MP 173.7 (Paving Only)

CLERK'S OFFICE UPDATE

Love Your Valley Festival

The Love Your Valley Fest was held on Saturday, May 20th. Everyone who attended really enjoyed the day, with 19 breweries participating, and great live music provided by Joint Point.

Two concert series sponsors, KVNF and Alpine Bank, advertised the festival on regional radio stations for a month prior to the event.

Two concert series sponsors, Ouray Riverside Resort and Chipeta Lodge and Spa, provided lodging on Saturday night for the brewers; and another sponsor, Orvis Hot Springs, provided two passes. Brewers were asked to bring two pony-kegs (or equivalent in cans), jockey box and a tent; and the Town provided tables, chairs and ice.

Participants that chose to sample the micro-brews paid a \$25 fee for a tasting glass and wristband; proceeds benefit the free concert series. Receipts from participants was \$9,800. The last LYVF was held in 2019, and receipts were \$11,740 for a \$20 participant fee. Weather during the event was nice and rain free, though there were rains in surrounding areas, perhaps this was the reason attendance was down from 2019.

Ridgway Concert Series

The 16th annual Concert Series will be held this year on July 6th, 13th, 20th and 27th.

Two of our sponsors contributed \$5,000 this year, which is twice the amount of major sponsorship, so I am listing them as "Major-Major Sponsors".

We had a great response from non-profit organizations interested in joining us in the beer tent during the concert series. We mailed letters to 40 local non-profit organizations and received responses from Home Trust of Ouray County; Ridgway Fire Protection District; Ridgway Area Trails; Ouray County Baseball; Voyager Youth Program; George Gardner Scholarship Fund; Ouray County Food Pantry; Ridgway Western Heritage Society; Ridgway Community Garden; Ouray County Soccer Club; Ridgway Pickleball Club; Ouray Mountain Rescue; Minerva West Performing Arts.



A random drawing from the list was held in mid-May and the organizations chosen were:

- Ouray County Soccer Club
- Ouray Mountain Rescue
- George Gardner Scholarship Fund
- Ridgway Area Trails Group

The participating organizations will be providing 12 volunteers over the age of 21 to work from 5:30 to 10:00 p.m. the night of the show. They will receive 10% of the receipts for the night, which will be calculated after all costs are deducted, and half of the tips collected that night.

Colorado Creative Industries Summit

Mayor John Clark, Arielle Bielak and Tera Wick attended the Colorado Creative Industries district convening and summit May 31 – June 2 at the Crested Butte Center for the Arts. John, Arielle, and Tera will be scheduling a detailed summit report and discussion with FUSE in July.

May 31 was a convening of Colorado Creative districts from around the state who shared highlights from their programming.
