INTRODUCTION

This monthly report serves as an update to the Town Council on key projects, activities, and community issues.

EIAF AWARD

The Town has been informed by the Colorado Department of Local Affairs that it has been awarded \$600,000 to assist with the *Ductile Iron Water Line Replacement Project*! Our project was reviewed based on a variety of factors such as its connection to energy impact, degree of need, measurable outcomes, amount of request, relationship to community goals, level of local match and community support, management capacity, resiliency and readiness to go.

GREEN STREET PARK MASTER PLANNING MEETING TO BE HELD ON APRIL 18TH

To kick-off the master planning process for Green Street Park, the Town of Ridgway and Superbloom will host a public meeting on Thursday, April 18th at 5:30 p.m. at the Decker Community Room, located at 675 Clinton St.

The purpose of the meeting is for members of the public and various stakeholder groups to meet the Superbloom team and provide thoughts and ideas on the future of Green Street Park. Superbloom was recently selected by the Town, after a competitive solicitation process, to provide a plan, process, and approach for the public engagement and master planning for Green Street Park.

ANNUAL STREET IMPROVEMENT OPERATIONS TO BEGIN APRIL 15TH

The Town will commence annual street improvement operations on April 15th. This year, annual street improvement operations will be split up into two segments. In the first segment, which will run from April 15th through April 26th, Public Works personnel will add gravel to the unpaved street sections that need to be built up. The second segment, which will run from May 13th through May 31st, will consist of Public Works personnel using a street grader to restore the driving surface and drainage attributes to the Town's unpaved streets. The process will also include the application of a dust suppressant agent, known as magnesium chloride, to the unpaved streets.

Motorists are asked to exercise extreme caution when driving in the area of a grading operation. Residents are asked to have vehicles removed from streets that are scheduled to be graded by 6:00 a.m. The Town of Ridgway greatly appreciates your patience and cooperation!



ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY

The Ridgway Town Council has committed to picking up trash and litter along Hwy 62 from milepost 20 to 22 for another two years! The commitment is to pick up litter a minimum of two times each year. The new agreement with CDOT expires in January of 2026. All participating group members will have to view the Spruce Up Colorado Volunteer Safety Video and Meth Lab Waste Recognition Video prior to any planned pick-ups. The time has come to pinpoint a date and time to hold another clean up event this spring or summer!

TRI-AGENCY DINNER

With the City of Ouray hosting the last Tri-Agency Dinner back in December, it's now the Town's turn to host the event. The time has come to pinpoint some date options to share with Ouray County and the City of Ouray.

CLEARNETWORX CONTINUING WORK ON "RIDGWAY SOUTH" FIBER INTERNET PROJECT

On April 1st, Clearnetworx crews picked up where they left off in the fall and started work on their "Ridgway South" fiber internet project. They began trenching and boring operations to continue laying conduit and fiber in the Solar Ranch and Le Ranch subdivisions. Residents will start to see paint and flags from other utility providers throughout the area. There are a few steps after excavation like fiber jetting and splicing before residents will be



able to connect to the Clearnetworx service, but those activities are not expected to impact area residents or the roadways.

Clearnetworx crews will visit adjacent property owners to provide a description of the work they are undertaking and contact information if questions or concerns arise.

COLORADO RIVER DISTRICT'S STATE OF THE RIVER MEETING (UNCOMPAHGRE RIVER)

The Colorado River District's State of the River meetings are a spring tradition in Western Colorado. Originally designed to give residents a peek at upcoming water forecasts, these casual, public-information events include a look at the upcoming hydrology, a summary of major western water issues, and a spotlight on projects and



priorities of each local community. At the March 19 State of the River (Uncompander River) Meeting held at the Ouray County 4H Center, Town staff gave a presentation on the Town of Ridgway Growing Water Smart Action Plan.

<u>UPDATE RE MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL MULTI-HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN AND THE COMMUNITY WILDFIRE PROTECTION PLAN</u>

Ouray County and JEO Consulting Group have finally come to an agreement on the contracts for the Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan (MHP) and Community Wildfire Protection (CWPP) plans. These contracts are scheduled to go before the Board of County Commissioners on April 16th.

As a reminder, Ouray County has received a grant up to \$100,000.00 from the USFS through the West Region Wildfire Council for the CWPP and has received a grant award through the Federal



Hazard Mitigation Grant Program from the State of Colorado Office of Emergency Management for up to \$89,974.89 plus a 10% local match for the MHP.

Last month, a Review Committee recommended that the Board of County Commissioners award the Bid for both the CWPP update and the MHP to JEO Consulting Group.


